YESTERDAY'S GAME WON BY MOULTON IN NINTH

Locals Ahead up to Ninth When Visitors Scored Two Runs and Won in Score of 3 to 2.

Moulton won the first of a series of three games with the Eagle Lake team here yesterday in a score of 3 to 2. The Eagle Lake team had the game won up to the last inning when a couple of hits by the visitors and a costly error by the home team scored two runs for Moulton. "Big Chief" was in fine trim and pitched a splendid game—but luck was against him. Waddell played his usual good game behind the bat, and led the batting record, his stick work having scored both of Eagle Lake's runs. Glazeir was first man up for Eagle Lake. He walked, and the next two batters struck out. Glazeir stole second and Waddell hit a long drive to center scoring the runner from the second bag. The score remained 1 to 0 in favor of the locals until the seventh inning when the visitors got a man on third and a man on second with no outs. Chateau struck out the next two batters. With two strikes on the third batter, Mylius scored on a passed ball. Ainsel got to first on a scratch hit in the eighth, and Waddell scored him from that bag with a clean three-base hit to left field. The ninth inning is where we lost. With a man on first a grounder was knocked to Boatwright at first. He handled the chance nicely and tried for a double play at second, but the second-bagger failed to touch the runner and Rhiner was safe at second. Mylius hit to right for two bags, scoring Rhiner from second, and scoring himself on the third batter. Fred Beakes at short for the locals played a fast game of ball. Batteries—Eagle Lake: Chateau and Waddell for Moulton; Grabusko and Holt. Struck out by Chateau 12; by Grabusko 11. Hits off Grabusko 6, hits off Chateau 6. Base on balls off Grabusko 2; off Chateau 0. Hit by Chateau 1. Umpire Middleton.

The same two teams will play again this afternoon and again tomorrow. We were unable to get the battery of the visitors for today's game, but Boatwright and Waddell will work for the locals.
