....Eagle Lake's Wonderful Bass.... A Story of the Yesterday.

I once heard T. W. Pierce, president of the Galveston, Harrisburg and San Antonio railway, say that it was worth the trip from Boston to Texas just to eat black bass caught out of Eagle Lake. Those bass used to be famous until the march of civilization and the advancement of commerce destroyed the lake as a fishing place and converted it into a money-making concern.

The lake was, and still is, a large one, and its beauty was equal to its attractiveness as a fishing place. I don't know the exact size of the lake, but the portion of it that formed the best fishing place was about a mile square. The surface of the water was broken by a few small, rocky islets, and these formed the sheltering spots for the fish when they were not busy allowing themselves to be caught.

No bait was used in taking the bass. All that was used was a long cane pole with a line tied to its end. The hook was concealed in a little patch of colored flannel or the hairs from the tail of a deer. In fishing one man sat in the stern of the boat and paddled it slowly forward, making just as little noise as possible. The fishermen sat in the bow of the boat and from time to time dropped the prepared hook in the water near the edges of the rocky islets. If the fish refused to bite it was dull and stupid work, but when they had their minds on their business there was action enough to please the most exacting fisherman.

I remember the first time I tried that kind of fishing. I thought it the most stupid thing I had ever encountered. One must know that black bass are fastidious. Everything has to be exactly to their liking before they take any interest in biting. If there are too few or too many clouds obscuring or not obscuring the sky they will not notice the most tempting bait through directly in front of them. Everything must be just exactly to their liking or it is all off.

Something must have been wrong the morning I went out, for I bobbed and bobbed faithfully for nearly an hour with no other results than a very tired arm. Then just as I was about to abandon the whole thing and turn my attention to the magnificent white perch that I could see hiding under the lily pads all about me, my pole was nearly snatched from my hand and I realized that I had hooked a big one. There was no play about it. The bass seized the barb and jerked the whole line and part of the pole clear under the water before I realized what was going on. Then we had it up and down for a few minutes and I drew him into the boat. It was a magnificent bass, one of the largest I had ever seen. I threw him in the bottom of the boat and cast again. Then I realized what fine sport it was. The bass had come to life in earnest and they acted as if they had not seen food for

a week, they were so ravenous. Just as fast as I could throw out my line they grabbed the hook and in thirty minutes I had the bottom of the boat covered with as fine a lot of fish as I ever saw. They were nearly all big ones and I am confident they weighed over two pounds each, while there were a few that weighed nearly twice that much.

Just as the sport was getting exciting they stopped biting just as suddenly as they had begun and no amount of cajoling nor persuasion could induce them to take the hook again. The man who was paddling the boat pointed over to a big lily patch twenty or thirty feet away, and there, face of the water, with only his nose and eyes showing above the water, was the biggest alligator I ever saw. I suppose he was about ten or twelve feet long, but he looked twice that large in the water.

He did not show the least fear of us and swam along slowly, passing just ahead of our boat, which had stopped when we saw him. Unfortunately, or perhaps fortunately for us, we did not have a gun with us. Had we had one I don't know what would have happened. A fortunate shot might have disabled the alligator or killed him outright, while on the other hand we might have simply wounded him and he would have had us at his mercy.

During the day we saw quite a number of alligators, and learned a few things about them. They were as tame as the lake was famous for its alligators as it was for its fish. Now catching those bass was a treat and eating them was another. After I had tasted them I agreed with Mr. Pierce that it was worth a trip across the continent. To that time fish had been fish and nothing more to me.

However, when I tasted the Eagle Lake bass I realized for the first time that there must be something to the taste of the epicure besides foolish notion. I was actually prepared to believe the story Joe Campbell used to tell on Leon Blum, whose taste in eating was so exquisite that Mr. Campbell swore that Blum could eat a quail in the dark and tell exactly what county in Texas the quail came from. After I found out the difference in the taste of Eagle Lake bass and other fish I was almost tempted to learn how to eat and become an epicure myself.—S. O. Young in Houston Chronicle.
