up finally. He didn't fit into en-
terprise, just as his prototype of

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COLORADO RIVER FLOODS ALL THE LOWLAND FARMS

More than 36-Foot Rise Puts Wa-
ter Over Many Low Land
Farms Through Bottoms.

The government gauge at Col-
umbus yesterday afternoon showed
the Colorado river 36 feet and 2
inches and still rising. A foot
of water reported above was being
expected to reach Columbus last
night. The river has overflowed
all the lowland farms. It is es-
timated that 1800 acres tributary
to Columbus have been overlowed,
and possibly 10,000 acres in the
county. The overflow has destroyed
the crops and bringing ruin to
the farmers. Many of the pota-
to farmers have also lost heavily,
not only by the continued rains
but from the overflow waters of
the river which have reached out
over a great many of the potato
farms.
