Demonstration Agent Kolberg Is Giving Matter Wide Publicity and Urges Your Help.

Editor Headlight: It is very gratifying to note the increasing interest shown in this subject by the business men of Eagle Lake, as witness the letter in your last issue by Mr. J. E. Roberts, and the whole-hearted efforts of the members of the Business League of Eagle Lake in backing financially, and otherwise the Farmers' Summer School, which is to be conducted here for one week, July 6th to 11th. There is nothing of more vital importance to the welfare of a city than the welfare of the farms and farmers surrounding it. This fact has been painfully apparent to all thinking men in recent years. There are many who are studying the question of getting the tiller of the soil and the grower of live stock to realize the extreme necessity for changing and improving their farms and methods of farming.

Here is an opportunity presented to us by the farm demonstration department, in co-operation with the Texas A. & M. College, to bring a part of the agriculture college staff to our farmers here in our own county. The summer school for farmers here at Eagle Lake will be as nearly as possible identical with the regular agricultural short course at the A. & M. College, arranged in such a way as to give direct and practical instruction to those who attend. It is not a farmers' institute, having no direct connection with the state farmers' institutes, being, instead, directly in charge of the United States farm demonstration work co-operating with the A. & M. College.

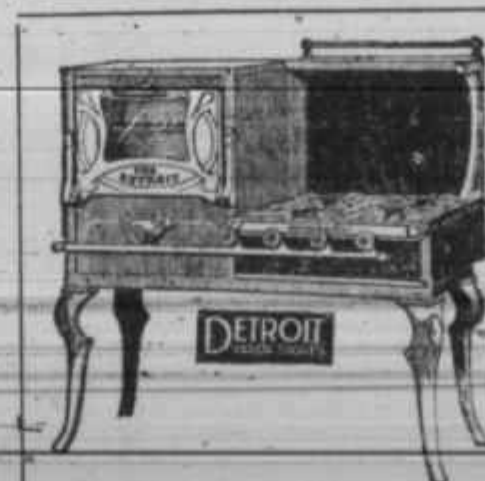
