

Rose Petal Beads
Gather rose petals for several days, keep in a bag in a cool place so they will not wither or mold until enough has been collected. Grind the petals, using the finest blade of a meat grinder. Put the mass in an iron pan or pot. It must be iron, the rustier the utensil, the better. Set in a cool place and stir frequently to prevent scorching. Grind this mass nine successive days when it will have become as black as ebony and ready for making the beads. Spread a paper upon the table, dump the mass upon it. Pinch off enough to make a good sized marble (the beads shrink one half) and roll smooth. Have long pins ready and as each bead is finished run a pin through it, stick upon a cushion or a board to dry thoroughly. When dry, moisten with olive oil and polish with velvet. String on strong, waxed thread, alternating with gold or silver beads to give contrast and brightness.

The beads will become almost as hard as wood, a beautiful black, and will retain their fragrance indefinitely. A chain of them is indeed a treasure. —The Mathis Informer.
