ENLARGING STOCK FEED BUSINESS AT SUGARLAND

Sugarland, Texas, June 13.—
Mr. W. T. Eldridge, executive
head of the varied industries of
this place, arrived home yesterday
from a sojourn of three weeks in
New York. He announces that plans
have been perfected for the manufacturing
on a vast scale of Mixrite stock
feed. This patent has recently been
taken over by a strong company,
including Eastern capitalists. It is
planned to at once erect a million-gallon storage

tank for the handling of blackstrap molasses imported from Cuba. This product, which enters largely into the stock feed, is thus far without commercial value in Cuba. It is disposed of by pumping into the ocean or by burning.

The feed manufacturing plant here is to be largely augmented immediately.

However, plants can be grown almost anywhere along the shores if fresh water can be obtained, and there are a few small fertile oases. Fifty years ago, indeed, the more ignorant people of Palestine believed that the Dead Sea was a visitable lake of fire and brimstone, a picturesque fantasy fostered, no doubt, by the fact that mists can often be seen rolling up from the water and it shines with a curious phosphorescence.

Strangely heavy are waves which beat along the sterile shores and crash against the bows of the few boats that navigate the Dead Sea. They contain 24 per cent salt, while ordinary sea water contains 3 per cent. Bulk for bulk, Dead Sea water is heavier than the human body, and so it is impossible to sink in it. When you have waded out to your ramps, the water floats you. One swims in the Dead Sea with his shoulders well out of water, but he must be careful not to get water in his eyes and mouth, for it is exceedingly bitter and inflames the eyes. Chloride of calcium makes it smooth and oily to the touch. But at that a swim in the Dead Sea is good fun.
