ENGINEER NAGEL GETS RIVER LEVEE SURVEY

One Thousand Dollars Raised Monday Night to Defray Preliminary Expenses in Levee District.

As predicted in the Headlight of last week, Hon. J. C. Nagel, of the State Board of Water Engineers, was called in by the committee having charge of the levee proposition along the Colorado river near Eagle Lake, and spent Saturday and Sunday of last week in consultation with the committee and in going over the ground of the proposed levee. It was Mr. Nagel's opinion from a view of the ground that a survey would show that the levee would be feasible.

An enthusiastic meeting of the parties interested was held at the Cotton school house Monday night, and every one present seemed heartily in favor of pushing the work. The committee was instructed to employ Mr. Nagel to make the survey, with Messrs. Abney & Mitchell of this city as his assistants in the field.

At this meeting one thousand dollars was subscribed which will be applied to the preliminary expenses, and any surplus will be spent in building levee, where it is most needed pending the incorporation of the district, sale of bonds and letting of the necessary contracts. The committee hopes to increase the amount of this subscription so that a great deal of work can be done within the shortest possible time.

There was hardly a man present at the meeting Monday night but whose losses this year alone by reason of the spring floods would make it impossible for him to take care of the bond issue for the full time the bonds will run. It is the present plan of the men having the matter in charge to run the back line of the district along the high water line of the December flood, and in connection with the building of the levee open up the bayous and drains.

By following this plan the owners

along the river front of the district will obtain the most protection from the floods (and in consideration of this protection it is expected that all such owners will donate to the levee district the land necessary for the right of way for the levee) but the owners along the back line will be continuously benefited by having the drainage of their land improved. It was the opinion of the engineers that the river is preparing to cut a new channel for itself through the bed of Old Cahey and that if it is not checked a few more rises will cut off a great part of the land to the other side of the river. The proposition thus becomes of vital interest to every owner in the bottom, and it is to their interest to co-operate in a brotherly way to a common good.

The employment of Mr. Nagel as engineer of the construction and location work is a guarantee that the work will be done properly, as Mr. Nagel is recognized as the best practical field engineer in the state and has had wide experience in the construction of levees.

It is figured that if the work is undertaken at all, according to the present assessment of lands, a man owning 1000 acres of bottom land would pay only \$82.50 taxes per year under the assessment necessary to take care of the interest and sinking fund of the bonds in case the bonds run for only twenty years, and a smaller amount if the bonds run for a longer time. Whether or not the work will be undertaken will be determined upon the report of the engineers at a meeting of the land owners, notice of which will be given in the Headlight, but the parties interested say we can count on a levee.

SIX FOOT RATTLESNAKE WITH SEVENTEEN RATTLES KILLED

A large rattlesnake has been on exhibition at the W. E. Wolford saloon this week, which was killed on the W. D. Walker farm by Henry Roy, a negro.
