MADE TRIP TO EAST BERNARD MONDAY

MESSRS. J. R. Westmoreland, J. W. Westmoreland, W. A. Green and the Headlight editor made a trip in the Westmoreland car Wednesday to the Westmoreland ranch. This ranch contains 1300 acres of the best farming lands in Texas. Some of the cotton fields were perfectly white with cotton, others that had already produced three-quarters of a bale to the acre were ready to be picked again. We passed over some terrible roads in that country, occasioned by the recent rains, and when it comes to pulling mud holes that seem impossible for a car to cross, we'll put that Overland car and John Wright as engineer against the field. After visiting the ranch we went to East Bernard. This is one of the busiest little towns in South Texas. Its stores are stocked with a quantity of merchandise that you seldom find in small towns. But the finest corn and cotton country in Texas surround East Bernard, which makes it a good little town. The two gins there, at this time, had already ginned 3000 bales of cotton and there were about sixty bales of cotton waiting at the gins when we were there. We were informed by a conservative business man of that place, that the two gins would gin about 1500 bales more this season, and that he estimated that fully 500 bales had been lost by the unfavorable weather at picking time.

Election Order.

Be it ordered by the board of trustees of the Eagle Lake Independent School District that an election be held at the City Council room in the town of Eagle Lake in said Eagle Lake Independent School District on the 25th day of November, 1913, to determine whether the board of trustees of said district shall have power to annually levy and collect a tax upon all taxable property in said district, for the support and maintenance of public free schools in said Eagle Lake Independent School District, of and at the rate of not to exceed 50 cents on \$100.00 valuation such tax, if voted, to be levied and collected for the year 1913 and annually thereafter unless it be discontinued as provided by law.

J. E. Roberts is hereby appointed manager of said election, and he shall select two judges and two clerks to assist him in holding the same. None but property tax payers who are qualified voters in said Eagle Lake Independent School District, shall vote at said election.

A copy of this order signed by the president and attested by the secretary of this board shall serve as proper notice of said election, and the president shall cause notice of said election, to be given in accordance with law.

In testimony whereof, witness the signatures of the President and Secretary of said Eagle Lake Independent School District, affixed this thirteenth day of October 1913.
