An attempt was made to wreck a train on the Sunset near Alleton Monday night. A number of cross ties were piled across the track and on top of these was placed a signal light, which had been taken from one of the switches. Just what the idea intended by the party who placed the obstruction on the track is not known. If it was intended to wreck a train it does not seem probable that the light should be placed on top of the ties, or if robbery of the train was the intention, then what was the use of placing the obstruction on the track as the light would have stopped the train anyhow. Special Officer Baker of the Southern Pacific and Sheriff E. B. Mayes on Tuesday morning arrested a young Englishman, who gave his name as Wm. White. He is a young man about twenty-five years of age, and is a typical Englishman. It is said that he had slept that night close to where the obstruction was placed on the track. Whether the young Englishman had any connection with the offense is not known.
