INJUNCTION RESTRAINS RIVER LEVEE ELECTION.

At each succeeding hearing before the commissioners' court, some who were first in favor of it, afterwards opposing it, it became evident that the fight would be carried into the courts, but in just what form of proceeding, was not generally known until the granting of the injunction.

The writ of injunction restrains the election officers, Messrs. C. M. Womack, John Burns, Fritz Engelhard and E. P. Brisbois from holding the election, the contention of the petitioners being that the law by which it was authorized is unconstitutional. Attorneys W. S. Strickland and A. J. Wirtz, who represent the parties desiring the bond levy, are also enjoined, and the County Judge and County Commissioners are restrained from granting any further orders in the matter until the constitutionality of the law can be determined.

Hon. W. L. Adkins, represents the property owners who are opposing the bond issue, and while there are quite a number of them, only one, the Lakeside Irrigation Company, is made plaintiff in applying for the writ. It is understood that there will be a motion to dissolve the injunction, but that an appeal will be taken direct from the order granting the writ.

Some features of the Act providing for the establishment of levee districts, were recently held by the Supreme Court to be unconstitutional. According to Messrs. Strickland & Wirtz this decision will not be applicable to the present case, but in this, Mr. Adkins does not concur, and the Supreme Court, of course, will have to decide the point.

Improvement district No. 1 embraces the bottom land extending up the river from the levee of the Faber Planting Company, to a point just above the pumping station of the Lakeside Irrigation Company, and from the river bank to the bayou near the edge of the prairie. The lands included are as fertile as any in the county, and, therefore, equal to the best lands in

the state. If entirely protected from overflows, it is doubtful if a more desirable body of farming land could be found anywhere.

Those who opposed the district before the commissioners' court, claimed that much of the land included does not overflow except in such unusual floods as that of December, 1913, in which the proposed levee would afford no more protection than a cotton row—and that no possible levee could be made to turn such water. This point, however, is of course not raised by the injunction proceedings, and if it were, it would doubtless require high or authority than the Supreme Court to pass upon it. However, the report of the engineers does not claim that the proposed levee will afford protection against such floods.

The levee of the Faber Planting Company was erected several years ago at their own private expense, and afforded ample protection for all ordinary high water, but under the great flood of 1913 it was swept down. Mr. W. F.

Edridge, the head of the company, and Mr. Chas. Davis, the manager, claim that they were amply remunerated for the expense of constructing the levee, by the protection afforded to their immense crops of sugar cane during the years the levee stood, and they are now rebuilding it and making it much stronger than before. They are not asking for any assistance from outsiders, but are simply leveeing their own land, at their own expense. If their efforts prove as successful as they hope, it will be a great object lesson for others.

It is said the owners of possibly two-thirds of the land embraced in the proposed district are against it. They claim their lands are susceptible to only the unusual overflows as that of 1913, and since the engineers' report gives them no assurance for protection in such cases, it is their contention that their lands will get no protection from such a levee, and they contend that they fail to see why their lands should be taxed for the benefit of the other fellow.
