In the case of the State of Texas vs. W. A. Liermann, charged with the murder of Nic Brod in Columbus on August 1st, 1914, the final jury was selected Tuesday after exhausting a special venire of one hundred and twenty-five men. The case went to trial in the district court at Columbus the same day. The following verdict was returned: "We, the jury, find the defendant not guilty as charged in the indictment. Geo. Herder, Jr., Foreman."
