## LAKESIDE SUGAR MILL SOLD AND WILL BE MOVED TO CUBA

Half a Million Dollar Sugar Mill Property at Lakeside Sold This Week to New Orleans Parties and Will be Torn Down Later in Spring and Moved to Some Point in Cuba Where it Will be Operated.

The large Lakeside Sugar Refining Company's sugar mill and entire plant was sold this week to New Orleans parties who will move same to Cuba. The mill property was bought in some time since at trustee's sale by Jacob F. Moerschel of Jefferson City, Missouri. The mill was built by Saint Louis capital and originally cost about a half million dollars. The company went into the hands of a receiver several years ago and the property was sold at trustee's sale as above stated. The tearing down of the big mill preparatory to shipping it to Cuba, will be begun sometime later in the spring.

During the seasons when the Lakeside Sugar Refinery was operated here it was a big thing for Eagle Lake, had a large weekly pay roll and put lots of money in circulation here. The people of our town had hoped that conditions here would right themselves for the sugar business and that the mill would sooner or later be put in operation here again, but the selling of the property this week for the purpose of moving the mill to Cuba, has sealed the doom of that hope.

## FOUR MEN IN HOLD-UP ATTIRE WERE ARRESTED BY CITY MARSHAL VINEYARD

Four Men, Three With Caps Pulled Down Over Their Eyes, Coats on Wrong-Side-Out and Buttoned up Tight and Handkerchiefs Tied Over Their Faces, Taken Into Custody by City Marshal Vineyard.

Four men, three of them with handkerchiefs tied over their faces, caps pulled down over their eyes and coats on wrong side out and buttoned up tight, were taken into custody by City Marshal H. S. Vineyard shortly after twelve o'clock Wednesday night. City Marshal Vineyard and Mr. J. L. Baughman were walking down the Southern Pacific railroad track to the power plant, when the men stepped out from behind the stock pens. As soon they stepped out Mr. Vineyard pulled his gun on them and demanded "hands up." Just what was the intention of the men is not known, but it looks mighty suspicious to say the least. A few minutes before, the four men had been to the engine room at the light plant, where Mr. Henry Theuman is on night duty. Mr. Theuman says the men left the engine room, and just on the outside, pulled off their coats, turned them wrong side out, and then tied handkerchiefs over their faces. One of the four did not have a handkerchief over his face. If it was the intention of the men to hold up Mr. Vineyard

and Mr. Baughman, their city marshal beat 'em to it. Two of the men attempted to run, but Mr. Vineyard assured them if they didn't stop he would stop them, so they stopped. Since no fire arms could be found on them and they were not given a chance to say "hands up" if that was their intention, a charge of vagrancy was sworn out against them. They gave their names as Earl Meadows, E. A. Talbert, J. R. Allen and Otis Jones. One said he was from El Paso, but the others would not tell where they were from. They asked for a trial and were taken to the justice court room yesterday afternoon. While they were there, City Attorney Roca says they quoted him all kinds of law, showing, possibly, that they are familiar with the law. After they were taken to the court room for a trial they changed their minds and each entered a plea of guilty as charged. Fines were assessed against them and they were turned over to Mr. Frank Hillblod and are now doing time for the county on the road gang.
