





BUSINESS REVIVAL TO BE CONTINUED, ECONOMISTS SAY

New York, Dec. 31 .- As the 'year closes and the country's leading econmists, bankers and business men review the past 12 months and thempy to forecast the future, a contactly cheerful undertone is in evidence 14 is generally recognized that past year has been materially better than expected-that the business revival has developed, an unforescen vigor. Thus it is pointed out that the country has enjoyed an unprecedented milding boom, that the steel industry has outstripped all pre-war years in the matter of the rate of production and that buying of automobiles has sete a new high record. Deflation of prices has ceased and has been succeeded by a distinct firming up, em ployment is full and purchasing power n the urban and industrial districts is

In expressing a belief that the prescnt revival will continue with a moderate increase in vigor during the next business leaders do rot hesitate to point out that the skies are not cloudless. It is realized, for example, that the farmer's position is not yet wholly satisfactory. In many districts, and the Northwest in partic ular, farmers still are heavily in debt and are securing but modest returns for their crops. Some observers think that it will be fully two years before the situation in these districts will be restored to something like normal The view is held that conditions are gradtally on the mend, and the marked improvement which has occurred in the South as a result of the high prices\_obtained from the present cot ton crop is cited as an example o what might happen in the grain-growlecisive turn for the better.

Europe Needs U. S. Goods.

In this connection much emphasis is laid on the importance of the European situation. The economists point out that roughly one-third of country's wheat must be sold abroad. and that the price of wheat is determined in the world market. As Eurepe in the chief customer for our follows, so the argument rans, that our farmers can not receive advantageous prices for their grain as long as Européan purchasing power remains depleted. There -is- a very general agreement between bankers that th question of whether or not the country is to have a return full which is made in restoring peace and ommercial stability in Europe. Opin ions differ as to the precise steps which this country should take, but there is unanimity of opinion on the point and the country's welfare is intaken to improve the sit uation. With regard to European prospects, the attitude seems to h cne of cautious hopefulness. Conditions now are thought to be more facorable to a settlement of the repations question, but it is realized that progress in this matter heretofore has been slow and that the revival in the European trade, probably? will be gradual


