HOUSE JOINT RESOLUTION

Proposing an Amendment to Article III of the Constitution of the State of Texas, adopting a new Section to be known as Section 51-b, which shall provide that the Legislature shall have the power to provide assistance and restrictions as may be deemed by the Legislature expedient, for old-age assistance and for payment of same out of the State Treasury.

LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS

Section 1. That Article III of the Constitution of the State of Texas be amended by adding thereto a new Section to be known as Section 51-b, which shall read as follows:

"Section 51-b. The Legislature shall have the power to provide assistance and restrictions as may be deemed by the Legislature expedient, for old-age assistance and for payment of same out of the State Treasury. Section 2. The foregoing Constitutional Amendment shall be submitted to the voters of the State of Texas on the fourth Saturday of August, 1935, at which election there shall be printed on such ballot the following question:

"For the Amendment giving the Legislature the power to provide a System of Old-Age Assistance not to exceed Fifteen Dollars (\$15) per month per person and to accept from the Government of the United States financial aid for old-age assistance."

Section 3. The Governor of the State of Texas is hereby directed to issue the necessary proclamation for said election and to cause printed on the ballot the following question:

"For the Amendment giving the Legislature the power to provide a System of Old-Age Assistance not to exceed Fifteen Dollars (\$15) per month per person and to accept from the Government of the United States financial aid for old-age assistance."

Section 4. The sum of Five Thousand Dollars (\$5,000), or so much thereof as may be necessary, is hereby appropriated out of the funds in the Treasury of the State, not otherwise appropriated, to pay the expenses of said publication and election.

The above is a true and correct copy of the Joint Resolution of the Legislature of the State of Texas, passed on June 11, 1935.

DECEASED AT KILLEN

The following article from the Killen Herald, gives the correct information concerning the death of the little baby girl of Mr. and Mrs. R. F. Hampton of Houston, former popular actress of Eagle Lake.

Last Saturday afternoon little Sara Ann Hampton, daughter of Mr. and Mrs. R. F. Hampton of Houston, closed her eyes in death as the result of suffocation during the day.

The mother's mother, who has stepped from the room for a few moments returned to see if she was still sleeping. Horror-stricken, Miss Hampton found that the baby had died.

The baby had been placed under a quilted pad, over her little face and had turned her head in such a way that all air was shut out. Life had been left.

Sara Ann was born in Houston, October 26, 1934. She died in Killen at the home of her maternal grandparents, Mr. and Mrs. Tom Adams, June 1, 1935.
