Some people are said to be natural born artists or such, but some lucky hit has made these people try in that line, and turn their thoughts in that direction until they are artists, with actually perceiving how.

It is practice alone that brings the powers of the mind, as well as the body, to their perfection. Many an ability has been lost because the practice that was required to develop it has not been applied. No body is made anything by hearing of rules; practice must settle the thing.

WHAT WOMEN PAID TO BILLY SUNDAY IN UNKNOWN TO ANYONE
Chicago—The price the world paid Billy Sunday for a lifetime spent in "saving it from the devil" was a secret he took to the grave. Hundreds of thousands of dollars went down the sawdust trail to the altar in the tin pans the famed evangelist used as collection plates in his heyday, but even "Ma" Sunday said she had "no idea" of the total.

The size of his estate, which includes a ranch at Hood River, Ore., and his resort headquarters at Winona, Ind., she declined to divulge "even if I knew."

Offerings received in his "fund-raising" campaigns remained the only index to his income.

In New York City in 1917 he took in \$130,485 and gave it all to the Red Cross, the War Nurses and the

Young Men's Christian Association. In Chicago also in the war period, he collected \$85,000 and turned it over to the Pacific Garden Mission, which led him from the baseball field to the pulpit years before.

In Philadelphia he claimed \$1,724 converts in 11 weeks and collected \$51,136.

Typical of smaller cities was the 1913 campaign in South Bend, Ind., where \$24,727.98 was taken in seven weeks. Individual contributions ran as high as \$200.

It was Sunday's habit to give the offerings of particular nights to particular local charities or welfare work, but last night's collection was usually reserved for him and that amount was almost always the campaign high.
