State Senator William T. "Bill" Moore of Bryan visited Wharton County Junior College in Wharton Tuesday to meet with the president, Dr. Theodore Nickick, Jr., Dr. Victor H. Driscoll, chairman of the board of trustees, and members of the administrative staff and faculty.

The veteran legislator revealed he was highly impressed with the academic and vocational program at WCJC.

Senator Moore stated, "The junior college concept is the approach we should take to education."

He was sponsor of a bill which created the State Coordinating Board in 1965 and advocates "a stronger junior college program."

"Eventually you will see schools like Texas A and M concentrating on the last two years of graduate work," he predicted.
