Editorially Speaking

Farmers, Ranchers Urged To Participate in Farm Bureau

Today's farmers and ranchers are the backbone of the world. As agriculture becomes more and more efficient, fewer and fewer producers are needed to grow our food and fiber.

This efficiency means (1) that more people are free to work in other various industries to create the wealth of goods and services that we need to live, and (2) that less of the family take-home pay is needed to buy groceries. What it has also meant to producers is overproduction. Because of this, prices for farm products have risen nearly as much as prices for products are overproduced. Agricultural products today represent only about five percent of the total population of this country, if farmers and ranchers are ever to have any clout in the marketplace and in places where laws are made affecting their industry, they are going to have to get organized. This is no time for rugged individualism on the farm. It is the time for participation in a responsible organization.

The Colorado County Farm Bureau is conducting a county-wide drive for members February 14th through February 18th. Does any farmer or rancher own a year for renewal of his program. This is a sound approach to organizing. It is perhaps the only way to guarantee that organization is responsive to its membership.

The Colorado County Farm Bureau deserves the active support of all who make their living in agriculture.

According to the Petroleum Information Corporation, 5 new field discoveries were reported in Colorado County more than any other county in the upper Gulf Coast area last year.

Discovered were 5 Wilcox oil fields, 2 Wilcox gas fields and a Yegua oil field. The Wilcox, Yegua and Frio formations continue to provide the most discoveries in the Gulf Coast area in 1971.
