It is worth noting that the Christians who have the strongest faith in Christ's return today are motivated to live in just the same way.

The fact that Christ is coming again makes us live forever in the shadow of eternity. All of our values are changed when we know that what we have here is only temporary. The only things that really count are the things that are of eternal value. Our faith is finally more important than our finances, for example.

The expectancy of Christ's coming motivates fuller faithfulness to Christ. The hope of that coming enables us to endure many of life's difficulties. The knowledge that at the time of this coming the tangled affairs of human events will be straightened out and God's plan for righteous living will finally be in effect in our world gives the Christian hope. Are you ready for Jesus to come back?

MARKET REPORT

Columbus Livestock Commission Co. handled 346 head of cattle at last Thursday's sale.

Good to choice butcher calves sold 34 to 36 and yearlings 33.5 to 35.5. Heiferette packer cows went from 23 to 25, and commercial packer bulls 22 to 25.

Heavy Hereford and Angus steer calves sold 37 to 45 and yearlings 33 to 40 while crossbred steer calves sold 36 to 43 and yearlings 32 to 39. Good stocker cows and heifers brought \$195 to \$205 per head and 50 to 55c per pound.

Hog Cholera Quarantine Regulations

(County Agent Johnnie Cooper)

The hog cholera quarantine which Colorado County went under January 21 has caused inconvenience to many swine producers.

Planning marketing or slaughter operations in advance will make the job easier for all concerned.

Producers are urged to notify Fred Froelich-Colorado County inspector for the Texas Animal Health Commission - or the County Agent's office at least two or more days prior to the time swine are to be moved. Advance notice will allow trip and time planning so that all producers requesting petiole may obtain them.

Hog cholera, once on the farm, has gained a new foothold. Fifty-four counties are now under state quarantine, with 16 counties being under federal quarantine. Since the costly disease can be transmitted easily, hog producers are urged to use all precautions so that the disease will be curbed.

If producers notice any sign of sickness among hogs or the animals go off feed, suspect hog cholera. The animals should be checked immediately by a local veterinarian or state or federal animal health official. Farrowing problems, abortion, still-born pigs and weak or "shaker" pigs may be due to cholera.

To protect hogs from cholera, producers should follow these steps: Don't allow your pigs to mix with those of your neighbor. After hauling hogs, clean and disinfect your truck or trailer. Don't feed garbage or table scraps to hogs unless it has been properly cooked (30 minutes at 212 degrees F.). To be safer yet, avoid feeding garbage altogether. Check all animals regularly.

It is important to have sick hogs inspected by a veterinarian or a state or federal animal health official. Producers cannot collect indemnities on animals that die from hog cholera unless the animals have previously been inspected.

The recent hog cholera outbreak was a definite setback to the national hog cholera eradication program. Texas, which had entered the final phase of the program in early December, is now back in Phase III. A three-month

The bait is also being distributed at the County Agent's office in Columbus and at the precinct headquarters in the three other commissioners' precincts under a co-operative program with the Texas Department of Agriculture.
