ANSWER: Henrietta should file her return as an Unmarried Head of Household (possibly as a surviving widow with dependent child) claiming \$675 exemption for herself and \$675 for her son. She may also deduct as an itemized deduction up to \$600 as a child care expense since her child is her dependent and is under 13 years of age. The limit for

two or more children is \$900.
