AUSTIN, Tex. - A total of 312 separate proposals have been submitted to the Constitutional Convention.

Last day for filing the recommendations for individual or whole revisions of the Constitution brought the expected outpouring.

Each has been referred to an appropriate committee for study and processing before consideration on the convention floor.

Delegates who wish to submit proposals in the future must get permission of two-thirds of their colleagues.

Meanwhile, the convention has progressed through preliminary approval of the preamble and Bill of Rights - with an change over the old constitution.
