COUNTY AGENT'S NOTEBOOK

Fertilize House Plants With Care Fertilizer levels may be the key to poor growth problems in houseplants. Light intensity and duration as well as temperature should be considered before fertilizer is applied to houseplants. Plants use less fertilizer in winter months because there is less light and the days are shorter. Or, when three elements are required by plants - nitrogen, phosphorus and potassium - nitrogen is the most essential. It promotes stem and leaf growth. Phosphorus is needed for growth of young plants and later for stem structure and the production of abundant flowers and seeds. Potassium is important for formation of starch and sugars and for the movement of materials inside the plant. It also aids in root growth and helps maintain a balance between the other two elements.

One of the best times to add fertilizer is when making the original soil mix or when repotting the plant. Add slightly less than one teaspoon of 10-10-10 fertilizer (10 per cent nitrogen, 10 per cent phosphorus and 10 per cent potassium) to each six-inch pot of soil. To a four-inch pot, add one-third teaspoon. These are maximum rates. Measure carefully to avoid injury to the plants.

Some plants are established and need little fertilizer unless they are growing actively. For most house plants a monthly application of fertilizer in the summer will suffice.

Fertilize pot-grown plants with a prepared soluble fertilizer which can be applied in liquid form. To prepare your own solution, mix one teaspoon of 20-20-20 fertilizer in a gallon of water.

Apply this solution to plants, using the same amount you normally use for watering. Make applications regularly during the winter and every two weeks during the summer.
