Sheriff's Dept. Gets Back \$1000 Funds

An allocation of funds of \$1,000 was returned to the county sheriff's office for use in hiring part-time dispatchers in action by the Commissioners' Court Monday, returning funds to the sheriff's department, in part, that had been removed when the salaries were officially set for the January session. The court also approved the advertisement for bids for a new car for the sheriff's office.
Sheriff George (Doc) Mueller was on hand to request that \$1,000 be added to this budget from revenue sharing funds for hiring relief dispatchers in order that the three dispatchers and the jail manager would have one day each week off from duties.
The sheriff's office maintains a twenty-four a day dispatching service and although regular deputies fill in for part of the time that the dispatchers have a day off, the action leaves the department short-handed on these occasions. Addition of the \$1,000 funds would enable the sheriff to hire a part-time dispatcher for relief.
The court will accept bids at the March session for a new car for the sheriff's office to replace a 1964 Chevrolet model that had 219,000 miles on Jan. 2nd. Funds are set up in the regular budget for the purchase of the car, pointed out Judge Lester, Crane.

Work Started On 3.5 Miles of FM 102 South

Contractor Jones G. Fink and his workmen started improved work on FM 102 from a point just south of the Santa Fe Railroad tracks, a mile and half south of the city and the work will continue for a distance of three and three-fourth miles south to Matthews where FM 102 intersects with FM 950.
Total cost of the project will be \$100,000. Final plans for the work were completed by highway department officials, law enforcement officers and Commissioner Bill Stiles meeting in Columbus last Thursday.
Clarence Wiese, resident engineer for the Texas Highway Department, said that during the period of construction, expected to be about two months, traffic on 102 will be "pinched" down to one lane in many areas where the works underway and he called motorists to use extreme caution in that area during the working hours.
Wiese said that the work will include laying of a new asphalt stabilizing base on one side of the road or other and in some areas on both sides of the present paving in order to widen the road from 20 feet to 24 feet, providing for two 12-foot lanes. After laying the 6-inch stabilizing base, the entire paving area will be covered with from four to five inches of hot bit asphalt paving over the entire 24-foot width. This is expected to put the road to carry the heavy load of gravel trucks until the extension of FM 3013 can be made from its intersection with FM 102 to the city, south on a straighter and more direct routing to an intersection with FM 102 at the Wharton County line.
