**Remember The Alamo, Texans!**

March 2 is very little to many Americans, but to those things are always bigger in Texas, especially Independence Day.  
As one remembers and pictures 1835 onward, the smoke can be seen clearing away across a wide, blood-stained pasture in West Texas. The Alamo is standing all alone in opposition to Santa Anna's bloodythirsty hordes, with occasional crackles of rifle fire passing between the two factions. Brave men died in that lonely battle for freedom and liberty and every Texas back then "remembered the Alamo".  
Some days later, on the foggy morning of March 6, the Texas army under command of General Sam Houston brought Santa Anna's forces to a sad awakening. The surprised Mexican forces awoke that morning of April 21 in 1835 looking up into the muskets and cannons of some very angry Texans. The battle at San Jacinto was won in a short time by the Texas forces and Santa Anna was forced to sign a treaty giving Texas her independence and boundaries as far South as the Rio Grande.
