Fuel Allocation Procedures Are Listed

Farmer, Supplier Urged To Solve Problems

Clarification of procedures for farmers and ranchers to use in filing forms for fuel allocations were issued Friday by Delbert M. Fowler, Dallas, Regional Administrator for the Southwest Region of the Federal Energy Office (FEO).

"First of all I want to emphasize that the farmer should make every effort to solve his problem through his individual supplier," Fowler said.

"The farmer or rancher is entitled to 100 percent of his current requirements, and his supplier should see to it that his fuel is delivered," Fowler continued.

"But I also want to emphasize this does not exempt the farmer or rancher from using conservation measures like everyone else," Fowler said.

There are two instances where a person involved in agricultural production would apply directly to his state allocation office, if he encounters a problem. One is an end-user who does not qualify as a wholesale purchaser, he would apply to the state office on FEO Form 20 for assignment or adjustment, rather than to the regional office.

All of these situations relate to longer term actions, if in the short term, the farmer or rancher is out of fuel and is in a hardship case, he contacts his state allocation office and makes application on FEO Form 20.

"It is not necessary for the farmer or rancher who does not qualify as a wholesale purchaser to submit any form unless he finds himself in one of the situations described above," Fowler said.

Farm Bureau Asks End To Price Controls

The Texas Farm Bureau told Congressmen and Senators that price controls have failed and should not be extended beyond April 30.

In a letter to all members of the Texas delegation, TFB President J. T. (Red) Woodson said controls "have failed completely" and to "extend them would be a serious mistake." He said that inflation was caused by federal deficits and urged the Texas lawmakers to work for economy in government.

"The price freeze caused a number of distortions in our national economy," said the head of the 152,000-member farm organization. "The dollar has been devalued in world markets. Shortages of manufacturing supplies and consumer goods have developed. The energy crisis has been made worse by price controls."

Woodson said agriculture has suffered in many ways. "Fertilizer is in short supply," he said, "and baling and fencing wire is almost non-existent. Other farm production items - essential to feeding the Nation - are difficult to obtain. The brief attempt to control beef prices in 1973 brought chaos to the industry - and shortages to the meat counter."

In citing "failure" of controls, Woodson said that the Consumer Price Index has risen 13 percent since the freeze was begun in August, 1971, and that wholesale prices had increased more than 20 percent in that period.

SOCIAL SECURITY REMINDERS

Many people plan to apply for Social Security some time this year or may want to see the people at the Social Security office to find out about how much they can expect to receive if they reduce the amount of earnings and retire or partly retire. In 1974 you can earn up to \$2400.00 and still receive any Social Security checks you are eligible for, but if you earn over \$2400.00 it could prevent some checks coming to you. If you think you are ready to do more fishing or vacationing or whatever people do when they retire, and you want to see Social Security, you should keep in mind that there are several things you need to know from you.

Social Security can help you need or get a check to you faster if you remember your Social Security number. It is much better to take the Social Security card with you. If you are married and your wife is going to be 62 soon

(with 3 months of your visit to Social Security), you should take her with you and she should be prepared to tell them her number, when she married you, her maiden name, how much she earned the previous year, how much she was married previously, furnish the dates of all previous marriages, who she married, where she lived when each marriage ended. The worker who is applying should be prepared to furnish the dates of all his marriages, how much he earned the previous year, when he served in the military service, when he worked for the railroad if he did work for them after 1937. The Social Security number is important because your record of earnings is on file according to your number. No one else is supposed to have that number. There might be thousands of John Smiths, but no one else has your number. If you have children that are under 18 or 18 to 22 and unmarried and full-time students, they can qualify for pay if you do. Social Security will want to know all their Social Security numbers and all the dates of birth and their correct full names.

You should take your documents you plan to use to prove when you were born. If you were baptized before, the Social Security will want to see the baptismal certificate and make a copy of it. Or, if you had a birth record recorded publicly before you were age 5 they will want to see it. They don't keep the records. They make a copy

and return them to you. If you never had a birth certificate recorded before age 5 nor a baptismal certificate, don't let that prevent you from consulting Social Security. Social Security will be glad to help you in getting any proof you need if you need help. Other documents that may possibly be used to prove your age are insurance policies, Poll Tax Records, Bible, Lodge Record, School Census, U. S. Census, Medical Records, Children's Birth Certificates, Employment Records and others.

The Social Security office is located at 702 West Alamo, Brenham, Texas 77823. The phone number is 773-832-4561. You can call them Monday through Friday from 8:30 a.m. to 4:45 p.m. except on National holidays. You may write to them for information regarding your age proof or any Social Security problem. Many times an application can be completed by telephone or a question can be answered by phone, thereby saving you gasoline, time and money. Try to phone first. If you still need to see them, Social Security will be glad to help any way they can.
