Wallis-Orchard OK School Bonds 3 To 1

Four million dollars in school bonds for the new Wallis - Orchard - Independent School district were approved almost three to one in voting last Saturday, Mar. 30.

Total vote was 434 for and 157 against.

Funds will be used for the construction of a new school plant and for purchase of a school site between the two communities.

Voters in the new district will go to the polls Saturday to name trustees to the board of education. There are seven candidates from the Wallis area and four from Orchard. Voters must choose three of the board members from Wallis and three from Orchard and the seventh may be from either of the areas as they may choose.
