A young Texas, Billie Hanks Jr., 29, has concluded the largest evangelistic crusade in the 197-year history of this colorful seaport city in west Africa.

Billie Hanks Jr. is married to the former Ruth Elaine Brown. Her father, Albert Brown, was a former pastor for the First Baptist Church of Eagle Lake.

During 12 nights in the soccer stadium in Sierra Leone's capital city, 1,300 persons of various professions, of faith in Christ, and more than 2,600 others made decisions for Christ.

Veteran observers noted that the results were remarkable in a culture influenced heavily by Islam and pagan animistic cults and secret witchcraft societies.

Hanks, a Fort Worth who has gained a reputation as America's youngest international evangelist during travels through 46 countries, credited advance preparation by local Christians for the crusade's success.

The crusade, according to local observers, represents the first time that a demonstration of the church in the city has cooperated in a joint effort. It is the most successful evangelistic effort in Sierra Leone's history.

Longer Life Span In County

Life expectancy for the average resident of Colorado County has reached an all-time high.

A child born today to local parents has excellent prospects of living to the middle of the 21st century, even if there is no further improvement in the span of life.

His expectancy at birth is now 71.1 years, according to the "Institute of Health and Statistics" report for 1970. This compares with 59.7 years in 1950 and 66.2 in 1960.

Since the turn of the century, life expectancy has increased more than 25 years for the average person. Most of the gain was realized in the period between 1900 and 1950, when infant mortality was sharply reduced and when antibiotics and other drugs conquered many of the infectious diseases.

The added life span is reflected in the rising proportion of people reaching the age of 65 and beyond.

In Colorado County, some 1,000 men and 1,400 women, according to the 1970 census, are now in the 65 and over bracket, the latest Census Bureau figures show.
