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Household Social Sec. Reports Due

Housewives who employ help around the house on a regular basis have an important job to do before the end of April.
The quarterly report of wages and the Social Security contributions paid on those wages is due April 30 for the months of January, February and March. All household employees who are paid cash wages of \$50 or more by one employer in a calendar quarter are covered under Social Security.
Contributions are based only on cash wages. Cash on tokens given to the worker for car fare count as wages. The room and board allowance for a live-in domestic employee does not count. The worker and the employer each contribute 5.65 percent of the worker's wages to Social Security. In some cases the employer may choose to pay the entire 11.3 percent contribution. The employer is responsible under the law for making the reports.
