Let's Look Back 48 YEARS AGO

(March 27, 1926)

Responding to the petition circulated here last Saturday, asking the city council to call an election to decide by vote of the taxpayers whether the city hall should be erected on the McCarty lot, the lot purchased by the city for the purpose, or whether the only pretty spot in Eagle Lake - our city park - pretty in its greenery and general attractiveness - shall be done away with and the city hall erected right out in the very center of town. The council will order an election to be held in connection with the regular city election on the first Tuesday in April, a strong point being used by advocates for wrecking the park is that the park is not properly kept up.

This might be true, to a certain extent. But we already have our park, and improvements in it can be made by J. J. Winterman for the Lakeside Irrigation Company to Contractor R. H. Reese for the construction of a solid concrete building which will cover all of the pumping machinery at the company's pumping plant at Lakeside, the new building to cost approximately \$10,000. The Universal Motor Company, composed of R. H. McElhinney, O. E. Sinclair and Hayes Stephens, has let a contract to Contractor R. H. Education Finance Articles In Constitution Discussed

(By Rep. John Wilson)

When the Texas Constitutional Convention recessed in April, they voted to recess on Monday, May 6. I hope all Texans have had an opportunity to study the work of this Convention. In an effort to inform the people of District 30, I have tried to describe the various provisions of the proposed new Texas Constitution. Last time, I discussed Articles I-VI, and I plan to talk about Articles VII-XI now.

Article VII, or the Education Article, has a far-reaching effect on all Texans; it guarantees an equal educational opportunity below the college level to every citizen. The dedication of the Permanent and Available School Funds for public education is continued, and local school districts still maintain

The Local Government Article, IX, describes the powers

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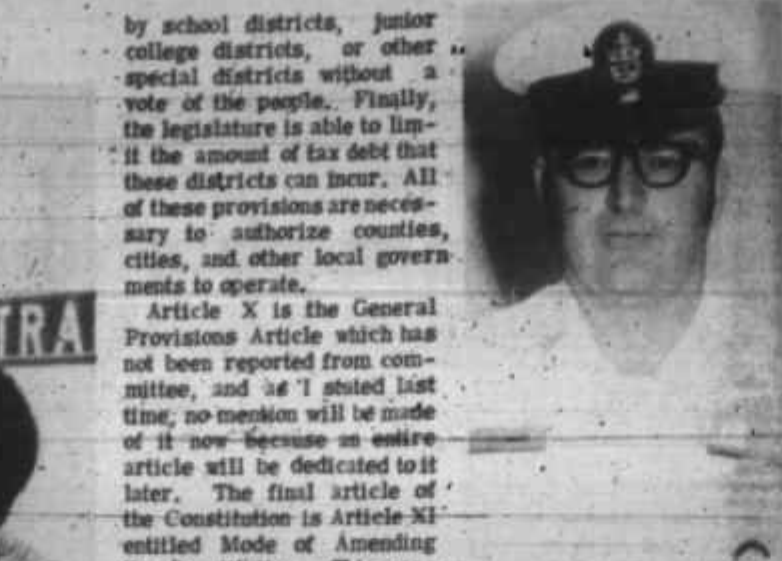

by school districts, junior college districts, or other special districts without a vote of the people. Finally, the legislature is able to limit the amount of tax debt that these districts can incur. All of these provisions are necessary to authorize counties, cities, and other local governments to operate.

Article X is the General Provisions Article which has not been reported from committee, and as I stated last time, no mention will be made of it now because an entire article will be dedicated to it later. The final article of the Constitution is Article XI entitled Mode of Amending the Constitution. This section requires that any amendment requires 2/3 approval by both House and Senate must be submitted to the voters. Secondly, every 30 years the legislature is required to ask the people whether or not to call a new constitutional convention to amend or rewrite the constitution by a set of delegates to be selected by law.

These articles, articles VII-XI, represent the latter half of the Convention's work. I hope that this discussion and last week's articles provide the voters of District 30 with a compact, yet comprehensive explanation of the proposed Texas Constitution. Only the voters can decide whether or not to call a new constitutional convention to amend or rewrite the constitution by a set of delegates to be selected by law.
