

Nursing Home Week May 12

Heritage House in Eagle Lake will join other nursing homes in Texas in celebrating Nursing Home Week, May 12-18, honoring patients and residents and sponsored by the Texas and American Nursing Home Associations.

This year's theme is "Nursing Homes—We Care."

52,000 beds in connection with statewide Nursing Home Week. TNHA listed these facts:

- In Texas the average size home is 81 beds. There are more than 360 licensed homes in the state, with about 62,000 beds.
- One type of nursing home is called an extended care facility which is a nursing home with medical supervision but not the critical standby equipment, which they don't need, found in hospitals. In such facilities the patient finds the care he needs at about one-fourth the cost of hospital care.

- Another type is the skilled nursing home. Its level of care is correlated to the government's Medicaid program and patient stays are generally longer in ECFs, however, because disabilities are of long-term nature. ECF homes are reimbursed for public welfare patients at the rate of \$14.79 per day or \$26 per hour.

- Levels intermediate between the two major types is Intermediate Care, or ICF, and usually provides a

Other members of the local club serving on the committee were W. H. Harrison, Gardner Duncan and Donald Oelshausen.

Dr. John Spaulding of the Wharton Rotary Club is the leader for the group. He is a general medical practice. He is in turn introduced each of the other members of the group and they gave a resume of their life in England and then answered questions from the audience.

William George Lewis is a police sergeant, 32 years of age, and is in the Crown Court business office. He is a member of the St. John's ambulance brigade and active in club work. He is married and has a son and a daughter.

David Charles Conner, 35, is married and has one son and is the editor of the Eagle Lake News and a script writer for the BBC and the ITV. His home town has a population of around 3000 persons. Bryan Joseph Eary (pronounced to Wyatt Eary), is 35, married and has two sons and is a lecturer in Management Studies at the Bath Technical College. Apart from two years in the national service he spent 14 years with various firms as an engineer.

Colin Robert Humphrey is 32 and single and built from Wellington. He is a solicitor, having passed the Law Society final this year. He is an active member of the Times ten Lines Club and specializes in real estate transactions. The final member of the group is Allan John Harvey, 54, married and one daughter and is a partner in two architectural offices and lives in a suburban town of 300. Yewell. He is a qualified architect and is interested in archeology and archery and is a member of his country's archery team. He described the various forms of community government in England.

Dr. Spaulding, in behalf of the group, expressed appreciation for the wonderful reception that they have received in this area. He added that

Vets Welcome At WCJC

A cordial welcome awaits military veterans at Wharton County Junior in Wharton where Veterans Counselor Linda Burjas says, "What are you going to do now that you are out of the service?"

"WCJC can help veterans whether they are trying to decide on a type of job they want or life in general," stresses Burjas.

The full time veterans counselor is available in the WCJC Office of Financial Aids, to talk about promoting career fields, financial aid, G. I. benefits and educational opportunities in general.

Veterans are urged to apply for G. I. benefits as soon as possible and application should be submitted to the Veterans Administration at least one month prior to college registration date.

To be eligible for VA funds, veterans must have served on active duty for more than 180 days (any part of which occurred after January 31, 1955). Eligibility ceases at the end of eight years from the date of the veteran's last release from active duty.

Pickle's Plan To Modernize Fire Fighting OK

U. S. Rep. Jack Pickle said Tuesday last week the House of Representatives had overwhelmingly approved his bill to modernize America's

fire fighting and fire prevention programs.

The bill, passed in a 352-12 vote, establishes a National Bureau of Fire Safety and a Fire Research Center, Pickle said.

Mr. Pickle noted the Senate has passed a similar fire bill and said he expects a conference version of the legislation to clear Congress this year.
