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2nd Summer Rec. Program Stated To Open May 28

Monday, May 28th will be the beginning date of the 2nd Annual Summer Recreation Program in Eagle Lake.

The program is designed to attract more participation along with the addition of track to the sports included in last year's program, says Major Denga, director of the program here.

A brief description of each of the event schedules is given below.

Track: Miss Fran Meyer, the "Big Girl" Coach, will meet all the Eagle Lake children, boys and girls, at the Middle School track at 5:00 p.m. on Tuesday, May 28th.

All children 7 through 17 years of age are eligible to participate. The children will be divided into four divisions for each sex to compete in several "yets" to be scheduled.

Gym: Jack Grammer will be the gym supervisor again this year. The gym hours will be from 2:00 p.m. to 6:00 p.m. on Tuesday, Wednesday, Thursday, and Friday.

Baseball: Coach Jack Grammer will contact the boys individually as to practice and game dates. The teams will be scheduled to play each other on a home-and-home basis.

The home games will be played at the City Park on Shelburn Street on Tuesdays, Wednesdays, or Fridays. A schedule will be available at a later date.

Lake girls at the Middle School Gym at 9:00 a.m. on May 28th to organize and group the girls for twirling.

The regular meeting date after the first meeting on the 28th will be on Mondays from 9:00 a.m. to 11:00 a.m.

Constitution: (By Rep. John Wilgus) The Texas Constitutional Convention swung back into business recently after a month long recess. The delegates immediately completed work on the Legislative Article which had been under consideration at the time of the recess.

The new Legislative Article deals with the definition, duties, and limitations of the legislative branch of state government. I hope to highlight a few of the changes in this discussion.

The first major change from the present system is the adoption of annual sessions. Whereas the Legislature met biennially, now it meets annually. The new proposal requires the Legislature to meet for 140 days in even-numbered years. Any type of legislation may be introduced in the sessions as the Legislature will attempt to serve better the needs of an ever-changing state.

Additionally, the Legislature is empowered to call itself into special session by a 2/3 vote of the Legislature. Presently, only the Governor can call a special session, and he can restrict the topics to be discussed. The primary cause of the special session is a bill that needs immediate action or a problem which merits the Legislature's undivided attention.

A third change in the new article is in the Legislature's power to override the Governor's veto. The Governor may veto a bill in the 140 day session, but the Legislature can override the veto by a 2/3 vote in both Houses during the next 90 day session. The ability to override a Governor's veto is, in itself, a change as the Legislature now cannot override a veto. Obviously, this power would be of no use if the Legislature were unable to meet annually or call itself into session to override the veto and receive the dead bill.

A final difference is the inclusion in the Article of a Salary Commission to set salaries for legislators rather than the present system of setting salaries by the Governor. This Commission will be a citizen's commission to recommend pay levels which could not be exceeded by the Legislature. The Commission will be made up of two citizens, one from each House, and one from the public. The Commission will be able to choose which method of legislative compensation they prefer.

These represent the major changes in the Legislative Article. As the branch of government closest to the people, any change in the structure directly affects your form of representation. A close examination of the Article should be made so that you understand fully the implications of this new Article.
