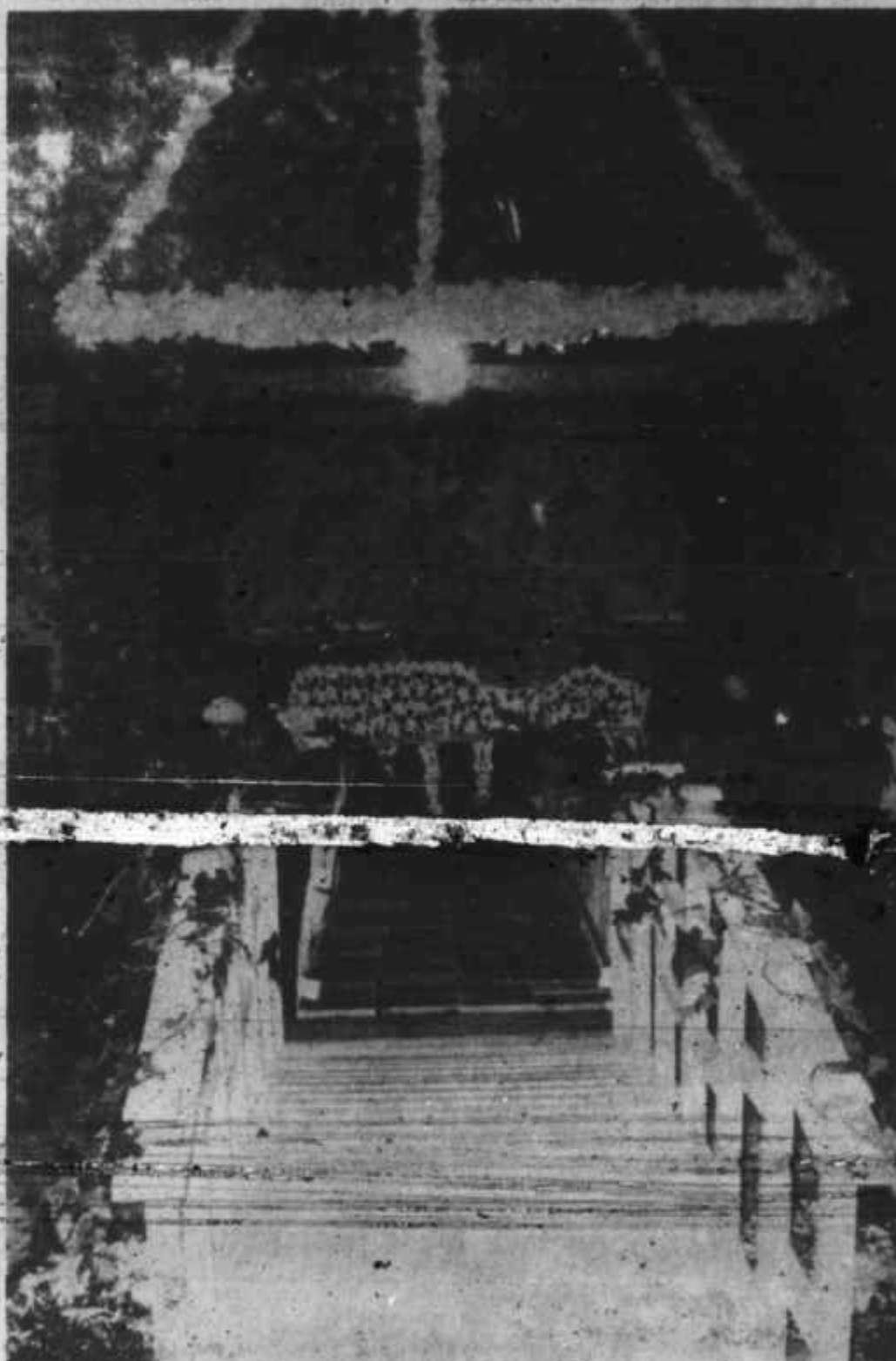


Entrance To Gaily Decorated Jr.-Sr. Prom Setting

At 8:30 p.m., the hurricane lamps which lined the walk leading to the school were lit. They were connected by English ivy with yellow streamers hanging from each lantern.

Four spotlights shone upon the theme letters, "Imagine," which were made of yellow posterboard outlined in green glitter.

A table covered with a yellow cloth was located in the entrance. Trillies led to the floral tunnel flanked on each side by large bouquets of paper flowers set to a group of green hedges.

A lattice fence ran from the tunnel across the lower part of the stage.

A grove was centered on the right wall upon entering the Commons. A statue was

placed in the middle with callidons and greenery around the bottom. Hanging baskets made of painted ice cream cartons holding ivy and greenery were found about the Commons.

Music Is Important Part Of School Curriculum

Pittie Tells School Board

Othel L. Pittie, Jr., of Eagle Lake appeared before the Rice Consolidated School Board last week in support of the music department. He discussed the great progress made by the band and also some of the future needs of the band.

Portions of his talk follow: "The 1973-74 Raider Band has distinguished both itself and the Rice District at the U.I.L. contests with division II ratings in marching, concert and sight reading performances indicating an above average band. The progress from a division IV in 1971-72 to a division III in 1972-73 to the current division II ratings is a testament to the talent and hard work of the band members and their teachers."

"This year there have been many contributions towards making an even better music program next year. Parents unofficially organized this year to provide the nucleus of a fund raising drive to stand in defense of the bandmen to Sam Houston State University Band Camp in June. Throughout the year, sound movies of most band performances to be used as a teaching aid for the band director."

"Actions described to this point have all been others doing things for the band. We like to think that this interest has spawned a new pride in the Raider Band exemplified this year by the band members own fund raising candy and bake sale and most impressively by the way in which they have decided to spend their hard earned money."

He added, "Nineteen seventy four is just a beginning for the spirit center of Rice School District. You can be proud of a division I in the future but you can expect a bunch of hard-working students and music teachers striving for performance and participation because they have confidence."

"Confidence comes from support at home. It's a feeling you can't buy, you have to generate it from within. You have to know that regardless of the outcome, everyone in the community is behind you and ultimately proud of you."

"Summarizing then, my purpose in appearing before you is to first of all thank you as a board for getting the music program off to a good start in our school system. Second to advise you of band parents and school interactions and third to encourage your lending a sympathetic ear to the bandmen's request for increased funding of the music program."
