Eagle Lake volunteer firemen were called to three fires during the past week. For the third week in a row there was an alarm on a Wednesday afternoon when the firemen were called to a grass fire near the City Ball Park in the Rice Mill area.

At 7:15 p.m. on July 4th the volunteers were called to a grass fire on railroad right of way just off FM 1903 between Eagle Lake and Chesterville; and at 5:35 p.m. Fri., July 5th the firemen were

called to a fire reported in a camper vehicle near the Dick Wood Minute Shop. All were extinguished with very minor damage.

No Injuries In Wreck Here Sunday Evening

Eight occupants of two vehicles escaped injury although damage to the two cars was fairly heavy in this area's only contribution to the Fourth of July holiday traffic toll. Eagle Lake Chief of Police Roy Chisum investigated the collision of a 1970 Buick driven west on 90A by William Engelhart of San Antonio and a 1968 Ford driven south on 90A by Henry H. Foster of Eagle Lake at 5:40 p.m. Sunday.
