Constitutional Con. Tries For Passage

(By Rep. John Wilson)
The Texas Constitution Convention has begun the final consideration of the proposed new constitution for Texas. The Convention has already made several preliminary attempts at final passage, but these are only preliminary attempts. In the last week, several votes have been taken, but these votes are serious and important only to the extent that they guide the Convention delegates in the formulation of the final document. I realize that this process seems confusing and time-consuming, but we are considering here a tremendous document, the document on which our state government is based. It is, therefore, necessary that we proceed carefully.

The document which the Convention has hammered out is a masterpiece of compromise. It is a document which will have to be passed by the voters themselves to decide upon. (1) A limited Home Rule provision (2) a Prohibition on Pari-Mutuel

Gambling provision. I have previously described these things, and I believe they are fairly self-explanatory. Another change is that if any submission does not pass, then these separate submissions will not become amendments to the old Constitution. This package is the one which I feel the delegates will pass by the necessary 2/3 vote when it is presented to the Convention.

In November 1972 the delegates of this Convention received a mandate to produce a new constitution for the people themselves to accept or reject. I feel that the delegates must adhere to that mandate. The final document which I feel will pass is the culmination of six months of hard work; this document is the best document which this Convention can produce. Thus, it is our duty to pass a constitution and to allow the voters to judge for themselves whether or not Texas should have a new Constitution.

CALLING ALL HOMEMAKERS

COLD WATER WASH
Washing in cold water may not be the best way to save energy on washing. Rewashing or a hot water soak is often necessary because cold water sometimes leaves soil and bacteria remaining. If you notice your laundry beginning to look gray or yellow after cold water washing, it isn't getting clean—but don't blame the machine when the washing method may be the problem.

Prewashing is one way to help cold water wash laundry clean. Another solution is to use enough detergent to compensate for the cooler water.

U. S. Department of Agriculture tests show that more bacteria remained in laundry washed in cold water without a disinfectant than in laundry washed in hot water without a disinfectant. When recommended amounts of chlorine were added to the wash cycle, bacteria count was reduced significantly, regardless of water temperature.

However, phenolic or pine oil disinfectants did little to reduce bacteria count in laundry washed in cold water with a special cold water detergent.
