WINDOW AIR CONDITIONERS

Dozens of companies sell hundreds of different models of window unit air conditioners. How can you be sure to choose the model best suited for your needs?

It is important to realize that a room air conditioner "conditions" the air in your home in four ways. Not only does it cool the air, but also dehumidifies, cleans, and circulates air in an enclosed space, room or zone. When the conditioner is turned on, a fan or blower draws in the warm, moist room air. The air passes through a filter which removes dust, lint, and other particles often found in the atmosphere.

When the air is cooled, it is blown back into the room. A thermostat maintains the desired room temperature, and grills or louvers on the front panel direct air circulation.

How much heat will window units remove from the air? Cooling capacity is expressed in BTU's (British Thermal Units). A 6,000 BTU air conditioner will remove 6,000 BTU's of heat per hour. The higher the BTU's per hour, the higher the cooling capacity, or the larger the unit.

It is also important, in selecting room air conditioners, to consider efficiency or as referred to in the industry, the EER (Energy Efficiency Ratio). The EER of any air conditioner is determined by dividing the BTU's per hour by the power input expressed in watts. For example, using this formula, let's compare two 12,000 BTU units. Unit A consumes 1900 watts of electricity per hour while Unit B consumes 1350 watts per hour. Unit A would have an EER of 6.3 while Unit B would have an EER of 8.9. Unit B is much more efficient, therefore, because it uses much less electricity to operate for one hour.

Your dealer can help you determine the size of your new unit. Many things must be considered, including room size and construction - sun exposure, window and insulation.

Window unit air conditioners clean, cool, dehumidify, and circulate the air. They are easy to install and operate, and require minimum service. Careful selection insures full enjoyment of all their advantages.

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Rice Board OK's Life Insurance And Annuity Plans For School Employees

Liability For Board Approved

Rice School Board of Education managed to muster a quorum and conducted the July session at the administration office Thursday night of last week and handled a number of insurance matters and other items of business.

The board approved the appointment of Robert Griffith of Brickland Insurance Agency as the agent of record for the 1974-75 year and Edwin Gay of Eagle Lake Insurance Agency as a participating agent.

The agent of record pays 70% of the insurance commission for coordinating and handling the insurance program and the participating agent 30%. Both Mr. Griffith and Mr. Gay had applied for the position of agent of record. Mr. Griffith having served in that capacity for the past year.

The board approved a new group life insurance program for the employees of the district upon the recommendation of a faculty committee composed of Roy Marshall, business manager and teachers with the National Investors Life Insurance Co. The committee included teachers James Moore, Betty Jansh, Claudine Shorter, Major Benges, Jesus Gonzalez and Byron Zalesky. The group student plan was approved by the board and came up for discussion and recommendation for National Investors Life. Premium for the basic policy of \$3000 will be 27¢ per \$100 and this includes accidental death and dismemberment. This premium will be paid by the district. Employees may, at their option, purchase additional term life insurance at the rate of 50¢ per \$100 and the amount that can be purchased ranges from \$2000 to \$22,000 depending on the salary of the individual. Those earning less than \$1000 may purchase \$2000 additional; earning \$1,000 to \$9,999 may buy \$7000, earning \$10,000 to \$14,999 may buy \$12,000; and those earning \$15,000 and over may buy \$22,000. Participants must purchase the full amount in their respective group.

Dependent's life insurance will also be available, \$1000 to \$2000 for spouses, \$1000 for children 6 mos. to 19 years, \$100 for children 14 days to 6 months. Costs for a family will be 75¢ per month for the \$2000 spouse plan or 50¢ for the \$1000 plan. The insurance will be convertible to ordinary life at the option of the employee without examination. The basic policy reduces 50% at age 65, another 50% at age 70 and terminates at age 75. Supplemental term insurance will terminate at age 65.

DEFERRED ANNUITY
The board also approved the addition of the Variable Annuity Life Insurance Co. to write annuity policies in the Rice District and added Aetna Life Insurance and the Franklin Life Insurance Companies. Sup. Krivacka pointed out that the latter two companies had no policies in effect at this time. Most of the 34 registered in the district are with Aetna National Life which was retained on the approved list. Under the deferred annuity plan, employees may set aside a portion of their earnings under a retirement plan and these will not be subject to income tax payment until such time as the teacher retires.

The annuity addition and deletions were made on recommendation of the faculty in-

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dividual. Those earning less than \$1000 may purchase \$2000 additional; earning \$1,000 to \$9,999 may buy \$7000, earning \$10,000 to \$14,999 may buy \$12,000; and those earning \$15,000 and over may buy \$22,000. Participants must purchase the full amount in their respective group.

Dependent's life insurance will also be available, \$1000 to \$2000 for spouses, \$1000 for children 6 mos. to 19 years, \$100 for children 14 days to 6 months. Costs for a family will be 75¢ per month for the \$2000 spouse plan or 50¢ for the \$1000 plan. The insurance will be convertible to ordinary life at the option of the employee without examination. The basic policy reduces 50% at age 65, another 50% at age 70 and terminates at age 75. Supplemental term insurance will terminate at age 65.

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
