Pickle Wants Constitution In Spanish, Too

U. S. Rep. J. J. (Jacks) Pickle said last week he is asking the House of Representatives to print 60,000 copies of the Constitution in the Spanish language. Pickle said, he is cosponsoring a House resolution to provide for the printing of the Constitution in Spanish through House printing facilities.

"At least six million, and up to nine million Americans utilize the Spanish language as their primary tongue," Pickle said. "It is a great shame that the Constitution is not available to these people. This resolution would at least insure that schools and public libraries possessed Spanish versions of our basic legal document."
