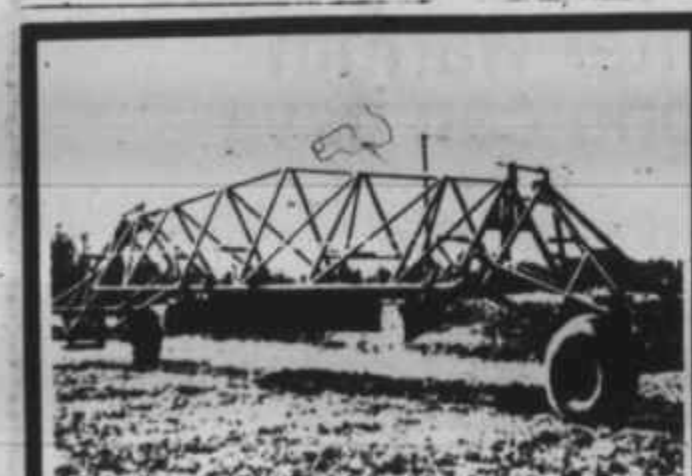

GOP Treasurer Candidate Bob Holt Visits Here

A change in the State Treasurer's office should be a priority concern for every Texan in 1974 regarding the party affiliation. Republican nominee Bob Holt told a news conference here last week.

The "encumbent took office in 1941, when I was eight years old—before World War II. If re-elected, he would be 74 years of age before stepping down," Holt pointed out.

Holt said that he believes his experience as a successful banker, a background in public accounting, and his familiarity with the University of Texas make him uniquely qualified to hold the post.

Holt commented, "Two years ago, Maurice Angly received 46% of the vote against the incumbent, and in the Democratic primary this spring, his opponent campaigned only briefly and received almost 45% of the vote."

Holt was here as part of a whirlwind schedule of campaign visits which will take him to most of the state's population centers by week's end.

State campaign headquarters for Holt have been opened at 1011 Congress Avenue in Austin.

Fish Violations Top 1,000 Mark

Summer has always been a time when game wardens come across more than the usual number of sport fishing violations.

This year it's gotten out of hand.

As of July 31, Texas Parks and Wildlife Department wardens filed 1,229 citations for various sport fishing infractions.

The majority, 1,067, were for failure to have a \$4.25 fishing license.

Following close behind the Texas who ran afoul of fishing laws were the 1,208 boat fishing enthusiasts who were cited for water safety violations.

Most failed to have the proper number of life jackets on board their crafts.

Fishing License Valid Year From Date Of Purchase

With this year's hunting and fishing licenses now available across most of Texas, the Parks and Wildlife Department reminds sportsmen that only the \$4.25 fishing license will be valid one year from the date of purchase.

Previously, the fishing license expired August 31 along with hunting licenses.

Now, if a fisherman buys a license on May 1, for instance, it will be valid until May of the following year.

Not so with the \$5.25 resident hunting or \$5.75 resident hunting and fishing combination licenses. They will continue to be valid from Sept. 1 of each year to Aug. 31 of the next year.

Soybean Field Day Sept. 11 At Beaumont

A Soybean Field Day September 11 at the Texas A&M University Agricultural Research and Extension Center at Beaumont will feature a variety of field tests and discussions relating to the total soybean production program.

According to Dr. J. P. Craigsmuir, resident director for the Texas Agricultural Experiment Station, registration for the field day will begin at 8:30 a.m. and a tour of field plots will get underway at 9 a.m.

On the tour members of the Experiment Station staff will discuss their latest findings on variety performance, seedling dates and rates, seed and weed control. Speakers will include Dr. John W. Sij, Dr. Glenn Whitney, Clarence C. Bowling, Dr. M. Daniels, and whose wife Hazel is the daughter of Mrs. A. Jenkins, all of Eagle Lake, graduated from recruit training at the Naval Training Center, Orlando, Fla.

The training included instruction in seamanship, military regulations, fire fighting, close order drill, first aid and Navy history.

Discussions on soybean disease and weed control and the overall management aspects of soybean production will follow the field tour. Speakers will be Extension Service specialists Dr. Walter J. Walla, Dr. Rupert D. Palmer and Hodges. Jefferson County Extension Agent Ed Weaver will preside.
