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Senior Student Receives Merit Commendation

One senior at Rice High School has been named Merit Commendation student by the National Merit Scholarship Corporation.

Principal Fred F. Graham announced that Carol Schoellman has received a letter of commendation. She is the daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Walter Schoellman of Nads.

This student is among the 38,000 Commended students named on the basis of their high performance on the 1973 Preliminary Scholastic Aptitude Test/National Merit Scholarship Qualifying Test (PSAT/NMQT). Commended students are in the upper 2 percent of those who are expected to graduate from high school in 1977. Although the Commended students ranked high on the PSAT/NMQT, their scores were just below those of the 10,000 semifinalists.
