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CROP Walk For Much Drilling Funds Sat., Oct. 26

"Giving hungry people overseas a chance for a change—that's what CROP is all about." CROP, launched in 1947 as the Christian Rural Overseas Program, is the Community Rungers Appeal of Church World Service. A walk for funds for CROP will be held here on Sat., Oct. 26th, when donations to CROP will be solicited on the basis of each mile walked by local volunteers. The objective is to collect funds and commodities to support overseas programs including nutritional feeding programs, development projects that help people help themselves and emergency assistance in time of disaster.

Working through regional offices serving 32 states and the District of Columbia, CROP annually provides approximately \$1 1/2 to \$2 million in cash and commodities for programs in 34 countries. CROP aid is distributed on the basis of need, with special emphasis on food, clothing and shelter.

Annual shipments of high protein foods, seed, tools, agricultural equipment, pesticides and fertilizer total about 5 million pounds. Clothing valued at about \$2 million is also distributed annually. Though created by churches and governed by a board composed of their representatives, CROP is self-supporting. It does not seek grants from denominations, but challenges all people, through public campaigns, to help stop hunger. Campaign Chairman Melburn Sibley reports that the Eagle Lake area has participated in CROP campaigns for several years.

A \$428,100 federal grant was forwarded to Texas for reimbursement of energy management programs this fiscal year.
