Cong. Pickle Asks Study Of Cattle Situation

U.S. Rep. J. J. "Jacks" Pickle has asked President Ford to exert leadership in the critical beef producing crisis facing America.

"There is a mystery in this country," Pickle said, "and this mystery is why the price of beef is so low on the hoof while still high in the supermarket."

Congressman Pickle expressed his thoughts to the President in a letter that also endorsed Governor Dolph Briscoe's (D-Tex.) request that the President meet with Texas cattle producers.

With costs up because of inflation, cattle people are receiving prices for their product at a loss figure. Recent surveys show, however, retail prices for beef in supermarkets are still high, which holds down consumer demand for meat.

"No one is telling the American people why all this is so, and no one in any branch of government is demonstrating the kind of leadership needed to correct the situation," Pickle said.

VA Home Loans On Upturn

The Veterans Administration reports the GI home loan program closed out fiscal year 1974 on a strong note despite limited availability of financing.

A. A. Hunter, VA Regional Office Director, said a June upturn in home loan activities brought the fiscal year 1974 total to 306,000 loans - 16 percent below fiscal year 1973 - but it was considered a good year, because activity for 1972 and 1973, fiscal year 1974 was the best since the peak years of the mid-1960s.

Compared to June a year ago, appraisal requests climbed 10 percent to 48,570, while applications for loans rose nearly 7 percent to 32,310.

Nat'l Guard Riot Exercise At Columbus

There's going to be a riot in Columbus Dec. 7. Not the usual kind of riot, of course. This one has been approved by the city council. This "riot" will be carried out by the 143rd Infantry of the Texas Army National Guard.

It's all part of their civil disturbance and riot control training.

In past years the National Guard has conducted its training session at Ellington Air Force Base.

But the National Guard told the city council that the air force base offered little realism.

The National Guard said it wanted to carry out its training session in a real town and picked Columbus.

About 500 personnel will move into Columbus on Dec. 7 and military "insurgents" will stage the "riot" during the early morning hours of Dec. 8.

The "riot" is expected to be over by 10 a.m. on Sunday, Dec. 8. Local fire and police departments also will be used to help control the "riot."

The National Guard will block off some streets around the courthouse square and will have some limited, motorized patrols around town.

It's not the first time that there's been a military-sponsored "riot" in Columbus. The National Guard used Columbus in 1968 for a similar training session.
