27th Garwood Lions Fair Was One of Finest

Lions Club Float

Best In Parade

The Garwood Lions Club staged another very successful Community Fair and Carnival last Saturday and many acclaimed the event as one of the "most" successful among the twenty-seven such events held by the Garwood Lions.

From the opening parade, viewed by hundreds, including the Consul-General from Honduras, the honorable Mr. and Mrs. Carlos Soto V., to the concluding event, the Fair of the Fair competition and awarding of prizes, it was a full day of activity on a nice autumn day. The sponsoring Garwood Lions and the many other participating organizations netted nice profits to carry out many worthy community projects.

The parade kicked off the day's activities at 10 a.m. and featured beautiful floats, other riding and marching entries and marching and music by four school bands from the Rice school district.

Colorado County Sheriff and Mrs. George (Doc) Mueller on horseback comprised the lead color guard.

Immediately following was the Rice Raider Band, then units of the Garwood Fire Department - a project of the Lions Club - including a 1928 unit, other trucks, the emergency vehicle.

Other bands in the parade were the Eagle Lake Junior High Band, the Garwood Junior High Band, and the Sheridan Junior High Band. Other marching units were entered by Lydia Enstrom's School of Dance and Marilyn Thomas' Super Strutters of Eagle Lake.

Four beautiful floats were entered in the parade. The entry of the Garwood Lions Club "Sight thru Lionsism," was judged winner of first place; the Nade Catholic Youth Organization won second with "American Pioneers"; and St. Mary's Civics Class won third with "Over the Rainbow."

Other prominent entries in the parade were: the MAYC of Eagle Lake featuring their 1974 Queen; the clown entry, Roy Dean Van Nort of Eagle Lake; Nade Lions, on a motorcycle; the Nade Knights of Columbus; a comical "Fat Lady"; the Lions; Kohllef and Shirley team.

Mr. and Mrs. Dan Supak and family had five antique cars in the parade route adding to the color and interest in the parade.

Commercial entries in the parade included: Breaker Motors Co. of Weimar, Lake Motors, Inc. of Eagle Lake; the Steve Taylor Ford, Inc. of Eagle Lake; Eagle Lake Insurance Co.; Blackie's Wrecker Service of Columbus; El Campo Marine Service; and J. T. Danklefs and Gifted Hill Co. Horseback riders were final entries in the parade.

Judges for the float competition were Mrs. C. T. Boye and Mrs. H. L. Wheeler of El Campo.

Booths for the entertainment of all ages opened following the parade and great interest was shown in the domestic exhibits in the gym. This was acclaimed by many as the heart of the Fair and the nearest thing in Colorado County to a true country fair. Results in the competition may be found in another article on page twelve.

At six-thirty p.m., the old Garwood gym was filled to overflowing for the crowning of the Fair of the Fair with a local girl, Miss Brenda Kallins, winning the honor. Full details may be found in an article on page 12 of this issue.
