DRIVE UNDERWAY TO RECRUIT 500 IN ADULT ED. CLASSES

The month of November has been designated for a special recruitment drive to enroll more than five hundred non-high school graduates in Adult Basic Education classes throughout Colorado, Matagorda and Wharton Counties.
 Campaign efforts were launched Saturday, Oct. 26 at Wharton County Junior College in Wharton where public school districts participated in an ABE teachers' training workshop.
 Emphasis was placed on "individualized instruction" and giving enrollees "what they feel they need to learn" according to Dr. John E. Brooks, director of the ABE Cooperative at WCJC, prime sponsor.
 Classes are free to anyone seventeen years of age or older who has had less than a high school education or who has been away from high school for a year.
 Instruction is offered in elementary grades 6-8, secondary grades 9-12, High School Equivalency (preparation for GED) and/or English as a second language.
 There is "open enrollment" in the continuing classes and students may register any time.
