Betty Crocker Offers College Scholarship

College scholarships, from \$500 to \$5,000, are available to all high school seniors through the Betty Crocker Search for Leadership in Family Living, formerly the Betty Crocker Search for American Homemakers of Tomorrow.
On Tuesday, December 3, each participating school will administer a 50-minute written examination. Research Associates, Inc., Chicago, a general knowledge and attitude examination is the first important step of the scholarship program.
From the examination results, a Betty Crocker Family Leader of Tomorrow receives a \$1,500 college scholarship while every state second-place winner receives a \$500 grant. The state winner also earns for his or her school a 20-volume reference work, "The Annals of America," from the Encyclopedia Britannica Education Corporation.
State winners accompanied by a faculty advisor will be guests of General Mills next spring on an expense-paid educational tour, which will include Washington, D.C., Williamsburg, Virginia. A special event of the tour is an announcement of the All-American Family Leader of Tomorrow.
