GARWOOD SCHOOL BUILDING REMOVAL PROPOSAL

The Rice CISD is accepting bids for the removal of the Garwood School Building on Garwood, Texas. The building may be inspected on any school day between the hours of 8 A.M. to 4 P.M. by contacting the Garwood School Principal, John Mader, Special Arrangements for inspecting the building in the evening or on weekends may be made by contacting Mr. Mader at 753-3355 or E. A. Krivicka, Superintendent of Schools, at 234-3531.

All bidders must agree to the following conditions and submit bids in accordance with the following details:

1. Mail bids to the Superintendent of Schools, Rice CISD, Drawer 333, Altair, Texas 77412, or hand deliver to the Superintendent's Office in the Rice CISD Administration Building in Altair. Bids must be mailed in sufficient time to arrive at the Superintendent's Office by 5 P.M. Monday, March 10, 1975. Late arriving bids will be returned unopened.

2. Envelopes containing bids must be sealed and clearly marked "Bids on Garwood School Building Removal".

3. Each bid must be accompanied by a certified check or money order in the amount of \$1,000 as a performance deposit. This will be returned to the successful bidder upon completion of the removal project as per specifications outlined in Items 4 and 5 below.

4. Successful bidder must agree not to begin removal until May 26, 1975, or thereafter, and assure the Rice CISD of completion by August 15, 1975. Failure to complete the removal by August 15, 1975, shall result in forfeiture of the performance deposit.

5. Superintendent of Schools of the Rice CISD shall be the sole judge when the removal specifications are met and shall issue a letter when he is satisfied the successful bidder has met all specifications.

6. The successful bidder shall be entitled to all materials salvaged from the building. The owner plans to remove all usable furnishings, equipment and fixtures by May 1, 1975.

7. The successful bidder agrees to remove all materials, equipment, debris incidental to demolition, concrete slabs in and adjacent to the building and foundations to a depth of 12" below the existing grade by the completion deadline of August 15, 1975.

8. A sketch outlining the building to be removed is available at the superintendent's office. The Rice CISD requests the cooperation of the successful bidder to remove that portion of the building attached to the currently used Elementary School Building as soon as possible when demolition commences. This will enable the Rice CISD to construct a replacement wall on the building that will remain, for the wall of the building to be removed is common to both buildings.

9. The Board of Education of the Rice CISD reserves the right to reject any or all bids.
