EDITORIALLY SPEAKING

Learn More About Your Schools During Public Schools Week

3 Nabbed For Stolen Car, Station Burglary

Alert work by a Sheriff's deputy, Deputy Targac, resulted in charges of burglary being filed on three men and they also were arrested for the theft of a car in Fort Worth.

Deputy Targac, who has been working on the case since 4:30 p.m. Tuesday, Feb. 25th when he noticed three men sitting in a 1969 Chevrolet with Florida license plates. He ran a check on the plates and found the vehicle to be stolen from Panama City, Fla. The officer returned to the store but found the car gone and later found the vehicle parked beside a street and the three men were arrested by Deputy Targac, Sheriff Doc Mueller and Columbus of Fort Worth.

Deputy Targac went to the scene and found that entry had been made into the outside machine with the use of a screwdriver or tire tool and coins taken from the machine.

Deputy Targac later found that the trio had paid for merchandise purchased at the Seven-Eleven store with a handful of coins.

Traveler Accosted, Robbed at IH10 Park

Ambulance Corps EMT Course Underway

On January 21 twenty-five of the thirty-two members of the Eagle Lake unit of the Colorado County Volunteer Ambulance Corps began their Emergency Medical Technician training course. Designed to make the personnel of this unit as well trained and capable as any professional technician, these courses are under the direct supervision of the state. Supervisor Fred Hanna was on hand for the first night's lecture on the purposes of the course and the responsibilities of the EMT.

The local members, as well as two men from Canada and four from El Campo, have put in over forty classroom hours at this writing. An additional 48 classroom hours are required. Dr. Raymond Thomas is directing the lecture sessions of the course while Herman Novak is in charge of teaching practical skills. The schedule of classes involves the students in a four-hour lecture session on Monday nights and another four hours of demonstration and practice of skills such as cardiopulmonary resuscitation (CPR), use of mechanical respiration devices and oxygen, bandaging, splinting, removal of victims from wrecks and autos, etc. on Thursday nights.

In addition to the Corps members average three twelve-hour tours of duty with the ambulance plus the study time involved in the course.

Emily Stiles, unit treasurer, remarked, "We knew it would be rough but we need this training if we are to be effective in providing emergency ambulance care to this community. We are teachers in our schools. We are a grateful voice of thanks to our families, whose patience and understanding
