The market was steady on all classes of stocker and feeder calves with excellent demand for all classes. The Wharton Stock Market Feb. 10th. Owners reported that slaughter cows and feeder calves were 1 to 3 weaker with most weakness on lower grade slaughter calves. Some packers have coolers full of low grade calves and are complaints the meat is not moving.

The firm handled 525 head of cattle during the sale.

Choice stocker and feeder steers in the 450 to 550 pound class were 27¢; steers in the 500 to 600 lb. group went 18 to 20¢ to 450 lb. Heifers sold 22 to 23¢; utility slaughter cows 18 to 21¢; utility slaughter bulls 23 to 26¢.
