 This day is a legal holiday in Texas in commemoration of its declaration of independence from Mexico. Late in 1835 a conference of citizens of Texas drew up a "Declaration of causes for taking arms against Mexico" in which it was stated that Texas would continue faithful to Mexico so long as that nation was governed by the constitution and laws "that were framed for the political association". This has sometimes been characterized as a declaration of independence because there were certain phrases in the document that might be interpreted in that way. But the conference by a large majority voted down a motion to secede. However, on March 2, 1836, while Santa Anna was occupying the Alamo, which he had just declared Texas to be independent of Mexico. This was signed by about sixty men, only two of whom were Mexicans. The declaration was made good by the battle of San Jacinto on April 21 in which Santa Anna was defeated by General Sam Houston. A constitution was drafted and General Houston was elected president of the new republic of Texas. Its independence was recognized by the United States on March 2, 1837.
