EDITORIAL SPEAKING

Report Child Abuse, Neglect To State Dept.

This week in Texas two children, probably less than three years old, will be sent to death by someone they love or trust. Two more will die next week. Two will die every week-on the average-until child abuse is brought under control.

A campaign against child abuse and child neglect has been launched in Texas. Television, radio, newspapers, films and other means are being used to inform the public. The Department of Public Welfare has hired more staff to respond to calls that are made and to protect the children of Texas. Mrs. Helen D. Juries, headquartered in Columbus, has been appointed as supervisor of nine-county area which includes Colorado County, Hubert R. Ostrick, P. W. Worker II of Columbus, who has been serving three-county area, will serve Colorado County only, as soon as caseworkers in the other two counties can be adequately trained.

It doesn't take much-just a phone call. Lift a finger, report child abuse and neglect. You may save a child. Should you suspect that a child is being abused or neglected, please call 782-5774. If you are unable to reach Mr. Ostrick or Mrs. Juries at that number, you may call toll free, anytime of the day or night 1-800-426-5400.

The Department of Public Welfare is also responsible for developing foster homes. Interested families are needed for children in need of a temporary home and a temporary family who can give him the love, the attention, and the help he needs. 2 Banks File Suits

Three suits were filed by two banks in the county seeking judgments on notes that allegedly are past due.

Columbus State Bank filed suit against George E. Sledge Jr. and James L. Britton III seeking to collect a balance of \$17,474.00 plus interest and attorney fees. The bank alleges this amount is past due from an original note for \$150,000 secured by \$44,000 worth of stock.

First National Bank of Eagle Lake filed suit against Clement Norris seeking a judgment for a balance of \$131 on an original note for \$4175.64, plus \$297.91 in interest and attorney's fees.

Default judgments were issued in District Court during the past week.

First State Bank of Weimar won the default judgment against R. J. Jaurig, one was for \$1500 plus interest and \$250 attorney's fees and the other for \$2422.37 plus \$147.37 in interest and \$500 for attorney's fees.

Kersh Denied Appeal In Bena Damage Suit

An order was entered in the 25th Judicial District court in this county this week from the Court of Civil Appeals in the First Supreme Judicial District denying an appeal filed by William Kersh from damages awarded to Henry Anton Bena and wife, Edna.

The Bena's were awarded a total of \$99,000 in damages as the result of an accident on Highway 90A at the entrance to the Lake Sheridan Road after the defendant's car or trucks failed to appear before Judge E. W. Patterson for trial of the case on Dec. 17, 1974.

In the default judgment, which, now stands, Mr. Bena was awarded \$77,945.25 for personal injuries and property damage and Mrs. Bena received an additional \$15,000.
