Heimann Gets Probation On 1 Murder Charge

A jury in Wharton County district court handed down a sentence of ten years of probation last Thursday in the charge of voluntary manslaughter against James Ray Heimann of Wallis. Heimann entered a plea of guilty to the charge in connection with the slaying of Michael Petrovsky, 27, of Needville in East Bernard last June. The decision was handed down before District Judge T. M. Gupion. Defending Heimann is James Skelton who is the attorney for David Owen Brooks, co-defendant with Elmer Wayne Henley in the Houston mass murder case.

Heimann still faces a second charge of murder in connection with the death of Mark Hough, 21, of Little in the same incident in East Bernard June 9th.
