## Rep. John Wilson Reports Texans Vote

### On Constitution

The Texas Legislature continues its 64th Legislative Session in Austin. The present State Constitution sets 140 days as the maximum length of the session, and over half the days have already expired. In this final half of the session the Legislature still has to deal with issues such as public school finance, state appropriations, and public utility regulation. One of the major unresolved problems in Texas is the controversy generated by last summer's unsuccessful constitutional convention. Last summer, the delegates to the Texas Constitutional Convention failed to muster the necessary two-thirds vote to approve the proposed constitution and send it to the voters. The citizens of Texas felt deprived of an opportunity to vote on the proposed Constitution, and I believe, rightly so. This session legislators, once again, attempted to re-construct the work of last year's Constitutional Convention and present to the voters a new proposed Constitution for Texas. ## Commr. Court Supports Two House Bills

Colorado County Commissioners' Court adopted resolutions Monday endorsing proposed legislation to increase the fees received from sale of auto license registrations, and asking that the state be responsible for payment of attorney's fees for indigents on trial in this county. Carl G. Smith of Harris County asked the court to consider endorsement of House Bill 1412 and Senate Bill 897 which would, if approved, increase fees from sale of plates. The bill proposed no change in the \$75,000 which the county gets for the initial sales of plates. Judge Lester Cranek pointed out, however, that another bill changes this \$75,000 if passed. Under the HB 1412 the county would get \$50 for each of the plates issued after the \$75,000 limit, up to 5,000 (this increases from \$25); and \$25 for each receipt after \$10,000 (from \$15); and \$15 for each receipt after 15,000 (now \$10). The sponsor of the bill pointed to constantly rising costs in the handling of the license plates. Judge Cranek said that Colorado County Tax Collector Henry J. Hajovsky, who handles sale of the plates, would expect very little appreciable difference if the bill were approved. The other endorsement went to House Bill 1229 which would assess the cost of attorneys appointed by the courts to represent indigents to the state, instead of the expense going to the county as under present law. Judge Cranek pointed out that the prevailing judges now set the fees for attorneys under minimums set out in the state constitution, and in the event of a long trial this could cost the county thousands of dollars. Judge Cranek also reported receipt of an opinion from Attorney General John Hill that the proposed constitution, after two days of debate eight separate amendments to the Constitution were adopted on April 4th, 1975. ## 26 Enrolled In Medication Aide Training

Twenty-six students are currently enrolled in the Medication Administration Aide Training Program being offered by the Rice Consolidated Independent School District. Each member must be currently employed in an approved station. The curriculum is based on 30 hours of classroom instruction, 15 hours clinical theory and 10 hours of supervised clinical experiences. Students completing the course will be placed upon a central roster maintained by the State Department of Health and will be certified to administer medication to patients under supervised conditions. Classes meet in the Science Department of the Eagle Lake Middle School on Monday and Wednesday from 7 to 9 p.m. Instructors for the program are local registered nurses, Mrs. Jean Darrow and Mrs. Edna Mae Kistevsky, who teach the section each.
