SCHOOL BIDS REJECTED

The court also opened bids for the proposed sale of one acre of land in the town of the Jones Survey in the unincorporated community 4 miles south of Frasherburg. The acre of land has been strip-mined to a depth of 10 feet or more. Two bids were received, one for \$31,000 and from the other for \$175,000. K. R. Elliston of the El Veed

Elliston asked the court, however, that the bid for the acre should be established by the costs.

The commissioners decided after consulting with the county engineer that it would cost more than \$500 to have the land surveyed, so they rejected the bids. Without participation in the federal Flood Disaster Protection Act, residents in the flood-prone areas of the city are unable to obtain flood protection insurance which is a requisite for funds obtained through federal lending institutions.

Other assessments included F. P. C. Hirschfeld, a one-half board who discussed responsibilities and duties of the school nurse; and Mrs. J. D. Seymour who is school nurse at Columbus. She pointed out that under the new law, the school nurse is required in full-time duties in the school.

She added that a county health nurse could serve as a referral for services and community.

Areas shown on the map as flood hazard areas were generally in the southern and southern areas of the city including an area bounded on the north by B street, on the south by the city limits, extending east to about seven streets and on the west to the city limits, generally on each side of the path of the river that goes through that area.

The city manager pointed out that at the present time without participation in the Flood Disaster Act, he is required to provide affidavits for flood protection insurance to be placed on the property in the areas. Under the Act the city manager would be relieved of that responsibility.

The issue of raising speed limits on FM 103 south from Eagle Lake was before the court and the court turned down the request because of the great amount of traffic, both vehicular and pedestrian, in the Eagle Lake Primary School.

Chief of Police Roy Chisholm, who has been asked that a five mile increase in speed limits be rejected for safety sake. The court went along with that request and indicated that it would like to see limits in the area of the school lowered instead of raised, especially during the evenings.
